STORM LEDGER AND CONDITIONS FOUND:

4:30 PM Roads are snow covered. Will call John in for a salt run and leave everyone else home for now. Forecast calling for 2-4 inches overnight.

6:30 PM 31° with light snow. Measured about 2 inches in the yard.

7:00 PM called everyone to come in and dust off their routes. We will plow all the main roads and then spot treat. Everyone will be home for the night and come back in at 5:00 AM

8:00 PM 30° with light to moderate snow. We have about 3 inches n the ground so far. Everyone is on their routes and plowing. Still holding with the original plan.

9:30 PM 31° with light snow. John has completed his main roads and he treated prospect. He is headed home till 5:00 AM. Everyone will be back at 5:00 AM. Allen will be longer as he is plowing with the grader.

5:00 AM 31° with a little accumulation overnight. Everyone will be scraping and cleaning up their routes, then treating after.

7:30 AM found damage on Old town Road. Apparently the plow truck dropped through the edge of the road. Later was able to determine it was caused by Mathewson's driver. I requested that they a) notify me of anything like that in the future, and b) place some type of cone or barricade until that spot fills in and freezes over.

11:30 All routes are done, found a broken brake can on the Mack, Allen and Bob are replacing. Everyone else headed home. Next storm has started already. Total accumulation of 3 inches.
